Jurassic Park

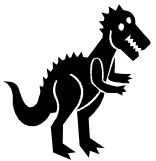
Which came first, the feather or the bird, and what does that have to do with dinosaurs? Discover answers

Attract or Repel?

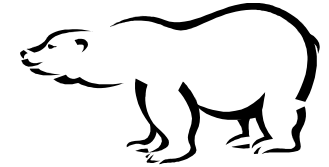

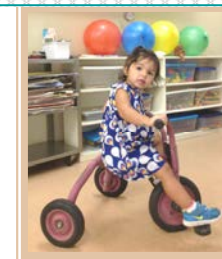
