

Joyce has presented for the American Montessori Society National Conferences for multiple years, and we were delighted she was able to share a plethora of valuable information and expertise with us.



Additionally, we are again excited several of our teachers will be attending the American Montessori Society National Conference in Louisiana Feb 27 – March 1st. AMS provides the leadership and inspiration to make Montessori a significant voice in education. Teachers not attending the conference will spend the day observing authentic Montessori area schools.

The Montessori environment is created for children of multi-ages. Because no two children grow and mature in exactly the same way the materials available to the children are varied and numerous. The proper activity for the right moment is there to be introduced to the child when he is ready or chosen by him as his interests dictate. Thus, no child is held back if his skills indicate a need to move on, nor is a child pressured to keep pace with skills he is not yet ready to master. The sensitive periods of each child can be capitalized upon in a multi-age classroom. Also, the advantages of a child entering the Montessori program early are several. The child has time to adapt to his environment and grow without unnecessary readjustments. The more experienced students assist the younger in their tasks creating a non-competitive and very caring atmosphere. We invite you to join us any morning to observe your children at work as well as any other level you may be interested in observing!

The advanced Montessori curriculum is available for your perusal upstairs in the faculty lounge – feel free to stop by and review it when you drop off or pick up your child. It very succinctly outlines the goals and objective of each lesson. Our Montessori professional library contains many wonderful books- DVDS- CD'S available for you to borrow as well. You may indeed find these materials very helpful as you grow in your understanding of this exciting approach to learning.


Kindergarteners Are A Busy Bunch!

Our Kindergarten students along with the older 4 year old students have the opportunity for an additional work cycle session each afternoon on the advanced curriculum for the 3rd year focusing on language arts – including the Jr. Great Books program – mathematics and writing working with 3-4 primary teachers- providing additional time for one on one les-
